1. Welcome & Introduction – Welcome given by Debbie Kopkau, best way to join in conversation is to use the call in number
2. Appoint Secretary – Kathy Jones volunteered to be acting secretary for the meeting
3. Approve minutes from meeting January 27, 2011 – Jim Olson moved to approve the minutes, with second from Ric Wiltse
4. Chair and Vice-Chair for 2011-12 – With the agreement of the membership in attendance, David Palme will be Chair and Sam Accorso will be Vice-Chair for 2011-12
5. MSBO Update – Debbie Kopkau reviewed the MSBO certification classes that are available in conjunction with the MACUL conference (March 16-18) and the MSBO conference (April 26-28), and the enrollments to date
6. MACUL Update – Ric Wiltse reported that the MACUL conference already had over 2900 registered, and the expectation was that 3500 would attend which would top last year's attendance. Ric indicated proposals are now being accepted for speakers at the Educational Technology Leadership Conference April 21, 2011, in Muskegon, MI.

7. REMC Update – Laura Hischke and Nancy Corner reported that the REMC Show Off for emerging classroom technologies held on February 10, 2011, in the Lansing Center, was very successful. REMC will be at the MACUL conference and will include a themed tag game for Smart Phone users. The REMC bid information is available on the REMC website.
8. Consolidation: MSBO Software and Services Clearinghouse Update – David Palme encourage all districts and ISDs to update their software application information on the MI K12 District Technology Survey (see link below). This is a starting point for gathering data about ISDs and LEAs technologies/software/services and whether they would be willing to share/host those services for other ISDs/LEAs. The goal is to create a searchable database for ISDs/LEAs interested in implementing new or updated services. The data is to be a resource for information only and not contain any rating system.

Guest Speaker: Paul Melson from Priority Health presented “ZeuS Botnets: Malware and ACH/EFT Fraud.” Paul did a great job of discussing technical concepts of Botnets, while at the same time explaining the “basics” so someone with a less technical background could understand the risks involved with ACH/EFT transfers and what you can do to protect your organization. Paul’s presentation included ZeuS Botnets which “steal” bank logins and malware “man-in-the-browser” which can “hi-jack” the user’s session to continue EFT transfers even after the user thinks he/she has logged off.
