Michigan School Business Officials (MSBO) offers a voluntary certification program.

The overall purpose of MSBO's Facilities/Operations Directors Certifications is to provide:

- Information and training for Facilities/Operations Directors that is specific to Michigan law and regulation.
- To provide a basis for advancing professionalism of Facilities/Operations Directors in Michigan public school districts.

For initial certification, three-hour sessions are required for the MSBO Voluntary Certification Program for Facilities/Operations Directors. All one hour and 20 minute sessions are considered elective credit toward certification. All clinic sessions can be used toward maintaining and renewing Facilities/Operations Directors Certifications.
