FY2023-24 Governor, House Subcommittee, and Senate Subcommittee Budget Proposals

<u>Governor's proposal</u> – introduced 2/8/23.

Senate bill substitute 173 – Subcommittee 4/25/23; Appropriations Committee 5/2/23.

House bill substitute 4286 – Subcommittee 4/27/23; Appropriations Committee 5/3/23.

Highlights of the three proposals and key differences as of May 3, 2023, include:

Sec. 6 Pupil Membership Definitions

GOVERNOR: Keeps current blended pupil membership of 90% current year fall count and 10% prior year spring count. (p. 4)

HOUSE: Revises blend to a two-year average of membership blend; intended to only impact districts with declining enrollment. (p. 5)

SENATE: No change to blend formula. Allows a district to claim membership of 1.2 FTE for pre-K students in a program that meets the requirements of added Section 32e. (p. 5)

Sec. 11 Total Appropriations

GOVERNOR: Total appropriation of \$20.9 billion including \$73.7 million in GF/GP. (p. 23) HOUSE: Total appropriation of \$21.4 billion including \$73.7 million in GF/GP. (p. 33) SENATE: Total appropriation of \$20.8 billion including \$88.9 million in GF/GP. (p. 33)

Sec. 11x School Consolidation and Infrastructure Fund and Consolidation Study

GOVERNOR: Deposits \$500 million from SAF into the School Consolidation and Instructure Fund (FY2022-23 only).

HOUSE: Deposits \$782.6 million from SAF into the School Consolidation and Instructure Fund (FY2022-23 only). (p. 41)

SENATE: No appropriations until the facility condition assessments from Section 11y are complete. (p. 40)

Sec. 11y Infrastructure Study

GOVERNOR: Eliminates one-time funding and repeals this section.

HOUSE: Concurs with Governor.

SENATE: Maintains current law. Appropriates \$20.0 million SAF for a statewide study of school buildings to determine the most cost-effective way to bring a building to health, safety, and wellness standards.

Sec. 11z School Aid Countercyclical Budget and Foundation Stabilization Fund

GOVERNOR: The school aid countercyclical budget and foundation stabilization fund is created as a separate account within the state school aid fund. For FY2023-24, \$900 million from SAF is deposited into the school aid countercyclical budget and foundation stabilization fund. (p. 27) HOUSE: Not included.

SENATE: School Aid Countercyclical Budget and Foundation Stabilization Fund is not included. New Senate section 11z appropriates \$50 million SAF in FY2022-23 to retire certain emergency loans and legacy debt for Pontiac, Benton Harbor, Ypsilanti, and Inkster school districts. (p. 44)

Sec. 12a Healthy Schools Program

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$300 million to address immediate health and safety infrastructure needs in school buildings and prioritizes distribution toward those districts with the greatest level of need. Each

participating school receiving funding must match at least 50% of funds received with other sources toward the completion of the project. Appropriation for FY2022-23 only. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Appropriates \$150 million for FY2022-23 only. On all other key points – concurs with Governor.

Sec. 12b School Health Centers Facilities Improvements

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$25 million to modernize and upgrade school-based health center facilities. Appropriation for FY2023-24 only.

HOUSE: Concurs with Governor.

SENATE: Not included.

Sec. 12c Consolidation Incentive Payments

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$245 million from the school consolidation and infrastructure fund created under section 11x and provides guidance on an existing feasibility study to incentivize the consolidation of back-end school district support activities. Funding would be awarded to districts to find cost efficiencies in consolidating functions like financial services, human resources, technology, and grants management. Appropriation for FY2023-24 only.

HOUSE: Concurs with Governor but grants support costs of consolidation or consolidation of services. SENATE: From the school consolidation and infrastructure fund created under section 11x, there is allocated for FY2023-24 only an amount not to exceed \$100 million for grants to districts and intermediate districts to support the initial costs of consolidating services that are identified in the intermediate district feasibility study conducted under section 11x.

Sec. 19 Compliance with Applicable Reporting Requirements

GOVERNOR: Requires equivalent of REP reporting updates every 30 days during the school year, rather than current twice per year.

HOUSE: Concurs with Governor.

SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Sec. 20 Foundation Allowance

GOVERNOR: Target foundation allowance is \$9,608 for FY 2023-24 (\$458 increase from FY2022-23 or 5% increase). The foundation allowance for cyber charter schools is \$7,687. Section 51e special education foundation allowance is calculated at 12.5% under section 51a and 87.5% under section 51e. (p. 34) HOUSE: Target foundation allowance is \$9,516 for FY 2023-24 (\$366 increase from FY2022-23 or 4% increase). The foundation allowance for cyber charter schools is \$9,150. Section 51e special education foundation allowance is calculated 100% under section 51e. (p. 55)

SENATE: Target foundation allowance is \$9,700 for FY 2023-24 (\$550 increase from FY2022-23 or 6% increase). The foundation allowance for cyber charter schools is \$7,760. Section 51e special education foundation allowance is calculated 100% under section 51e. (p. 55)

Sec. 20f Categorical Offset Payments

GOVERNOR: Maintains appropriation of \$18 million for FY2023-24. HOUSE: Repeals this section and eliminates this funding. SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Sec. 21h Partnership Model Districts

GOVERNOR: In addition to maintaining appropriation of \$6.1 million for FY2023-24, subsection 7 allocates an amount not to exceed \$36 million for 2023-2024 only for supplemental funding to be used for the purposes of this section in equal installments of \$12 million in each of the fiscal years 2023-24, 2024-25, and 2025-26. The funds allocated under this subsection for FY2023-24 are a work project appropriation, and any unexpended funds for FY2023-24 are carried forward into FY2024-25. The purpose of the work project is to provide assistance to districts eligible for funding under this section. The estimated completion date of the work project described in this subsection is September 30, 2026. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor.

SENATE: Subsection 7 allocates an amount not to exceed \$12 million for FY2023-24 only for supplemental funding to be used for the purposes of this section.

Sec. 22c Equity Payment

GOVERNOR: Includes \$3 million to ensure that out-of-formula districts receive a \$171 per-pupil increase. Only districts that received funds under this section in the immediately preceding fiscal year qualify under this section.

HOUSE: Concurs with Governor.

SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Sec. 22d Isolated Districts/Transportation Funding

GOVERNOR: Increases appropriation to \$9.3 million for FY2023-24. Allocates \$1.7 million to small, isolated districts.

HOUSE: Increases appropriation to \$11.1 million for FY2023-24. Adds intent for \$1.8 million reduction for FY2024-25. Increases allocation to small, isolated districts to \$3.5 million. Appropriates \$500,000 for FY2023-24 only for island districts with a toll bridge.

SENATE: Increases appropriation to \$11.7 million for FY2023-24. Adds intent for \$1.8 million reduction for FY2024-25. Increases allocation to small, isolated districts to \$3.5 million. Appropriates \$500,000 for FY2023-24 only for island districts with a toll bridge.

Sec. 22e School Debt Forgiveness NEW (House)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Appropriates \$40 million SAF for FY 2023-24 only to forgive outstanding debt for distressed districts, as determined by MDE and the Department of Treasury.

SENATE: Not included. Senate addresses debt repayment in section 11z.

Sec. 22k School Transportation Fund NEW (House)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Creates the School Transportation Fund. Deposits \$450 million SAF into the School Transportation Fund for FY2023-24 only.

SENATE: Not included.

Sec. 22I District Transportation NEW (House)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Appropriates \$150 million School Transportation Fund for FY2023-24 only for districts to offset transportation costs. Distributes funding by grouping districts into quartiles based on riders per square mile and funding the median transportation cost per rider for that quartile or the district's actual transportation costs per general education student, whichever is lesser.

SENATE: Not included.

Sec. 22m Technology Regional Data Hubs

GOVERNOR: Maintains appropriation of \$2,200,000 SAF for FY2023-24. HOUSE: Increases appropriation to \$3,200,000 SAF for FY2023-24 only. SENATE: Increases appropriation to \$3,500,000 SAF for FY2023-24 only.

Sec. 220 MiFamily Engagement Centers NEW (House)

GOVERNOR: Not included. HOUSE: Appropriates \$2.5 million for FY2023-24 only to ISDs to administer ten MiFamily Engagement Centers. SENATE: Not included.

Sec. 23f Learning Pods

GOVERNOR: Eliminates one-time funding and repeals this section. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Sec. 23g MI Kids Back on Track

GOVERNOR: Supplemental Request 2023-3 appropriates \$300 million SAF for FY2022-23 for per-pupil payments to eligible districts for implementing the MI Kids Back on Track program. Match at least 100% of funding received. Provides for a work project appropriation through September 30, 2025. HOUSE: Concurs with Executive to appropriate \$300 million SAF for FY2022-23 only but revises to include ISDs as eligible recipients. Match at least 50% of funding received. Concurs with Executive, but also includes technology, materials, or any purpose for which any district previously used funds received under Sec. 98c. Provides for a work project appropriation through September 30, 2025. SENATE: Appropriates \$100 million SAF for FY2022-23 only for payments to eligible district recipients. Match at least 100% of funding received. Provides for a work project appropriation through September 30, 2025.

Sec. 23h Mathematics Pathways

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$30,000,000 SAF for FY2023-24 only for districts and ISDs to support improvement of mathematics teaching and learning. Provides intent that these funds will be spent over two years.

HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Not included.

Sections 24, 24a, 25f, 25g, 26a, 26b, 26c, 26d – no change in appropriations per Governor's proposal. House & Senate concur on all listed sections.

Sections 27a, 27f, 27g - minor differences

Section 27h Mentoring Grants NEW

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$25 million SAF for FY2023-24 for grants to districts to support mentoring of new teachers, school counselors, and administrators.

HOUSE: Concurs with Governor on appropriation and most points.

SENATE: Not included.

Section 27i Rural Educator Credentialing Hub NEW

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$15 million SAF for FY2023-24 only for an educator preparation program to pilot the creation and implementation of a rural educator credentialing hub. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Not included.

Section 27j Administrator/ Principal Training on Special Education NEW

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$15 million SAF for FY2023-24 only for an educator preparation program to pilot the creation and implementation of a rural educator credentialing hub. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Not included.

Section 27k Student loan repayment assistance pilot NEW (Senate)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Not included.

SENATE: There is \$250 million SAF appropriated for FY2023-24 only for districts to implement a student loan repayment program in accordance with guidelines issued by the department, including a requirement that each eligible participant shall receive up to \$250 per month, or, if the eligible participant is employed in a district for which at least 75% of pupils are at-risk pupils, up to \$450 per month, for the duration of the program or the total amount of the eligible participant's federal student loan, whichever is less.

Section 27I Salary Incentive Pilot program NEW (Senate)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Not included.

SENATE: There is \$125 million SAF appropriated for FY2023-24 only to districts and intermediate districts for a salary incentive pilot program.

Section 27n SVSU Saginaw grow your own NEW (Senate)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Not included.

SENATE: There is \$2 million SAF appropriated for FY2023-24 only to Saginaw Public School District to fund the enrollment of employees of Saginaw Public School District in the Accelerated Certification with Residency (ACR) Program at Saginaw Valley State University for the employees to earn their teaching certificate.

Section 27o City Year fellowship NEW (Senate)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Not included.

SENATE: There is \$3 million SAF appropriated for FY2023-24 only to City Year Fellowship to be used for the expansion of the provision of English language and math tutoring services and opportunities to districts in this state.

Section 27p School board training reimbursement NEW (Senate)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Not included.

SENATE: There is \$250,000 SAF appropriated for FY2023-24 only to districts on a reimbursement basis toward the payment of costs associated with professional learning classes or sessions for school board members.

Section 27q Instructional coaches for Hamtramck NEW (Senate)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Not included.

SENATE: There is \$2 million SAF appropriated for FY2023-24 only to the school district of the City of Hamtamck to hire accelerated learning coaches for each of the 8 schools in the district and for the provision of professional development for these coaches.

GOVERNOR: Updates fiscal years and amounts to conform to recommended appropriations. HOUSE: Updates fiscal years and amounts to conform to recommended appropriations. SENATE: Updates fiscal years and amounts to conform to recommended appropriations.

Section 30c Troops to Teachers

GOVERNOR: Eliminates one-time funding and repeals this section. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Section 30d Expanded Breakfast and Lunch Programs NEW (Governor)

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$160,000,000 SAF for FY2023-24 for districts, ISDs, and the Michigan Schools for the Deaf and Blind to provide free school lunch and breakfast to all PreK-12 students. Requires recipients to provide breakfasts and lunches at no cost to all students, submit information regarding the number of meals provided, maximize federal reimbursement under the Community Eligibility Provision, meet all applicable state and federal standards, implement policies that require parents or guardians to fill out relevant family income information, and forgive all school meal debt. Pays recipients an amount equal to the federal rate per free breakfast and lunch pupil, less other federal and state meal payments. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor on FY2023-24 appropriation. Also appropriates \$25,000,000 SAF for FY2022-23. Adds requirement for districts to offer meals that meet dietary restrictions, including gluten free, vegetarian, vegan, and, upon request, kosher, halal, and any allergy restrictions as confirmed by a doctor's note. Revises requirement to forgive all debt to only apply beginning February 1, 2024. SENATE: Concurs with Governor on FY2023-24 appropriation. Also appropriates \$25,000,000 SAF for FY2022-23.

Section 30e Meals Meeting Dietary Restrictions NEW (House)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Appropriates \$10 million SAF for FY2022-23 only for districts and ISDs to offer meals that meet students' dietary restrictions, including gluten-free, vegetarian, vegan, and upon request, kosher, halal, and any allergy restrictions as confirmed by a doctor's note. Provides for a work project appropriation through September 30, 2024.

SENATE: Not included.

Sec. 31a At-Risk Funding / Adolescent Health Centers/ Hearing, Vision, and Dental Screenings

GOVERNOR: Increases appropriation to \$851.9 million for FY2023-24. Allocates \$812.2 million SAF for base at-risk funding, equal to 11.5% of the Target foundation allowance times the number of economically disadvantaged pupils in the preceding fiscal year. (p.78)

HOUSE: Increases appropriation to \$1.06 billion for FY2023-24. Allocates \$1.02 billion SAF for base atrisk funding and sets per-pupil weight to 35% of the Target foundation allowance. Allocation is sufficient to fund at 14.6% for FY2023-24. (p. 139)

SENATE: Increases appropriation to \$993.8 million for FY2023-24. Allocates \$920.6 million SAF for base at-risk funding, and each district or public school academy must be assigned to an opportunity index score each fiscal year which determines the reimbursement rate, ranging from 11.5% to 15.3% for FY2023-24. (p. 134)

Sec. 31K School Meal Forgiveness NEW (Governor)

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$1 million SAF for FY2023-24 only for the department to provide payments to eligible districts in an amount necessary to reimburse the eligible districts for the cost of forgiving all outstanding student-meal debt.

HOUSE: Appropriates \$2.5 million SAF for FY2023-24.

SENATE: Appropriates \$2.5 million SAF for FY2023-24.

Sec. 31m School Mental Health and Support Services Fund

GOVERNOR: Eliminates one-time funding and repeals this section. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Sec. 31n School Mental Health and Support Services

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$106.5 million SAF for FY2023-24. \$91.8 million through 31n6 for grants to ISD's.

HOUSE: Concurs with Governor.

SENATE: Appropriates \$106.5 million SAF for FY2023-24. \$87.2 million through 31n6 for grants to ISD's.

Sec. 310 Wraparound Support Services

GOVERNOR: Repeals this section.

HOUSE: Revises to allow for funding to cover staff hired to replace staff hired under this section.

Repeals section for FY2023-24.

SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Sec. 31p TRAILS

GOVERNOR: Supplemental Request 2022-3 maintains appropriation of \$50 million Federal SFRF for FY2022-23; clarifies that recipients must forward funding directly to the TRAILS program. Eliminates one-time funding and repeals section for FY2023-24.

HOUSE: Concurs with Governor.

SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Sec. 31q Discover You

GOVERNOR: Repeals this section. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Sec. 31aa Per-Pupil Mental Health Grant

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$300 million SAF for FY2023-24. It is intended that half the funds allocated in this section are distributed to districts during FY2023-24 and half are distributed during FY2024-25. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor.

SENATE: Appropriates \$310.5 million SAF and \$17.5 million GF/GP for FY2023-24. Includes ISD's and nonpublic schools and includes school safety, school infrastructure, and school resource officers as allowable uses, among other changes.

Sec. 31bb, 31cc, 31dd, 31ee - Multiple

GOVERNOR: Repeals these sections. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Section 31ff New - SMART (Senate), Brilliant Detroit (House)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Appropriates \$2,000,000 SAF for FY2023-24 only for districts to partner with a nonprofit for high-dosage neighborhood-based tutoring and direct noninstructional services for at-risk pupils ages three to twelve.

SENATE: Appropriates \$14,500,000 SAF and \$500,000 GF/GP to implement the SMART counselors program under PA 180 of 2022.

Section 32d GSRP

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$542.6 million SAF for FY2023-24. Expands eligibility to 300% of federal poverty guidelines. \$28 million for reimbursement of transportation costs. \$50 million for classroom start up grants.

HOUSE: Appropriates \$529.8 million SAF for FY2023-24. Expands eligibility to 275% of federal poverty guidelines. Concurs with Governor at \$28 million for reimbursement of transportation costs. \$63.5 million for classroom start up grants.

SENATE: Appropriates \$479.1 million SAF for FY2023-24. Keeps current eligibility at 250% of federal poverty guidelines.

Sec. 32e District-run pre-K programs NEW (Senate)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Not included.

SENATE: Sets the requirements for district-run Pre-K programs. A district that operates a district pre-K program under this section qualifies for the special membership counting provisions of section 6(4)(mm)

if the program meets the following requirements: Is offered at no cost on the same days and for the same number of hours as grade 1 instruction that is offered to pupils enrolled in the district and that is a compensatory classroom program designed to improve the readiness and subsequent achievement of the children enrolled; enrolls children who are at least 4, but less than 5, years of age as of September 1 of the school year in which the program is offered; ensures that it only uses qualified personnel for the program; the program has not received any funding under section 32d or 39 related to a child enrolled in the program; other requirements as listed. SENATE: Appropriates \$49,500,000 SAF and \$500,000 GF/GP for FY2022-23 only for before and after school programs for children in grades K-12. At least 60% of funding must go to CBOs.

Sec. 32n Before and After School Programs

GOVERNOR: Provides additional one-time appropriation of \$25 million Federal SFRF for FY 2023-24 only. HOUSE: Provides additional one-time appropriation of \$50 million Gross (\$25 million SAF and \$25 million SFRF) for FY2023-24 only.

SENATE: Concurs with Governor on amounts.

Sec. 32o Out of School Time NEW (House)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Appropriates \$25 million SAF and \$500,000 GF/GP for FY2023-24 only for Michigan Out of School Time programs. Allocates \$25 million SAF for Clinton County RESA to distribute to applicants as directed by the Michigan Out-of-School-Time (MOST) Council. Allocates \$300,000 GF/GP for MDE to support administration of the MOST Council. SENATE: Not included.

Sec. 32p Early Childhood Block Grant Program

GOVERNOR: Increases appropriation to \$26.9 million for FY2023-24. HOUSE: Increases appropriation to \$31.9 million for FY2023-24. Adds intent to reduce to \$18.5 million for FY2024-25.

SENATE: Keeps current appropriation of \$13.4 million for FY2023-24.

Sec. 32t 3-year-old Preschool Pilot (formerly Strong Beginnings)

GOVERNOR: Provides an additional onetime appropriation of \$18 million Federal SFRF for FY2023-24 only for Clinton County RESA to administer a three-year-old preschool program pilot for children who would otherwise be eligible for GSRP but are three years old.

HOUSE: Concurs with Executive to appropriate \$18 million Federal SFRF for FY 202324 only. SENATE: Appropriates \$12 million for FY2023-24.

Sec. 32u BookNook

GOVERNOR: Repeals this section and eliminates one-time funding of \$5 million. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Concurs with Governor.

Sec. 32v Early Childhood Workforce NEW (Governor)

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$50 million to assess the needs of the early childhood workforce, update and promote career pathways, pilot training and credentialing programs, and to increase recruitment efforts.

HOUSE: Not included. SENATE: Not included.

Sec. 32w GOAL Line Detroit NEW (Governor)

GOVERNOR: Appropriates \$6 million Federal SFRF for FY2023-24 only for GOAL Line Detroit to provide after school enrichment. Provides for a work project appropriation through September 30, 2027. HOUSE: Concurs with Governor. SENATE: Not included.

Sec. 32x Early Childhood Workforce NEW (House)

GOVERNOR: Not included.

HOUSE: Appropriates \$3.2 million SAF for FY2023-24 only to Wayne State University Law School for statewide implementation of the Learning by Hearings civic education program. Provides for a work project appropriation through September 30, 2027. SENATE: Not included.

Sec. 33 K-5 music education pilot NEW (Senate)

Its education management organization must comply with all requirements under FOIA as if it is a traditional school district. It must hold monthly school board meetings that meet all requirements under the Open Meetings Act. SENATE: Not included.
