ATTENDANCE

- Attendance Reasons
 - Method used to report attendance in SIS (i.e., positive attendance)
 - Teachers who do not take attendance
 - Lack of documentation



ATTENDANCE

- SAFEGUARDS & STRATEGIES
 - Run attendance report on count day to see who is absent from what class and track return dates.
 - Adjust FTE reported based on schedule and classes attended by 10/30 - day rule.
 - Make sure you have excused absence documentation for those excused on count day.
 - Require teachers to take attendance.

ALPHA LIST PROBLEMS

- Alpha List Reasons
 - District student information system (SIS) alpha list does not match MSDS alpha list.
 - Drop/add lists include pupils who have not been added or subtracted to/from the district SIS or MSDS alpha list.



ALPHA LIST PROBLEMS

- SAFEGUARDS & STRATEGIES
 - Review class lists and compare to SIS alpha roster and MSDS alpha roster to make sure the rosters included all pupils eligible and dropped those not eligible.
 - Follow-up on pupils with zero FTE.
 - Use MSDS Alpha for Download
 - Review drop/add list and compare to class lists.

PART-TIME AND REDUCED SCHEDULE **PUPILS**

Part-time Reasons

- Correct calculation of FTE: Pupil was claimed for FTE greater than hours of instruction scheduled/provided.
- Documentation was incomplete.
- Pupil was claimed by more than one district.

Reduced Schedule

- Student did not need a full schedule to graduate.
- Reason is not in best educational interest (work to buy a bike).
- Medical reason not documented by medical personnel for students with an IEP.



PART-TIME AND REDUCED SCHEDULE PUPILS

- SAFEGUARDS & STRATEGIES
 - Pupil claimed for FTE greater than hours of instruction scheduled/provided similar to "attendance" issue.
 - Review schedule and classes attended, adjust FTE accordingly.
 - If applicable, split part-time FTE accordingly between the districts/programs based on schedule and hours of instruction.
 - Verify the pupil did not participate as a shared-time pupil.
 - Does student meet requirements for reduced schedule?
 - Student with IEP and documented medical or emotional reason.
 - High schooler (9-12) with written request that is deemed in best educational interest of student and attending 80% of instructional hours (878.4 hours for 6-hour school day).



• TEACHER CERTIFICATION

TEACHER CERTIFICATION

- Teacher Certification Reasons
 - Grade level endorsement (applicable for 2023-2024)
 - Subject level endorsement (applicable beginning with 2024-2025)
 - Properly permitted
 - Timely permitted (permits are <u>not</u> retroactive): Teacher must be permitted before beginning a teaching assignment.
 - Teachers or substitute teachers are not reported in the REP.



TEACHER CERTIFICATION

- SAFEGUARDS & STRATEGIES
 - Work with HR to verify all teachers are currently certified, grade level and subject matter.
 - Verify teacher is reported in MOECS (subs too).
 - Make sure all teachers and substitute teachers are reported in REP.
 - Verify teacher is teaching course certified to teach.
 - Verify all teachers of record are certified in grade level and subject matter.
 - Use MSDS Teacher Credential Verification report.

SCHEDULES, AGE, & RESIDENCY

- Housekeeping Reasons
 - Wrong date of birth
 - Schedules were not updated for what was in place on count day
 - Incomplete schedules
 - Placeholders
 - Incorrect residency codes
 - Missing or improper release/schools of choice applications




SCHEDULES, AGE, & RESIDENCY

- SAFEGUARDS & STRATEGIES
 - Review enrollment paperwork to verify date of birth.
 - Review and verify pupil schedules.
 - Are all classes listed, including dual enrollment?
 - Run less than full schedule reports in SIS.
 - Run reports looking for placeholder classes.
 - Verify residency codes are correct.
 - Verify residency documentation is correct for nonresidents.
 - Approved application within the schools of choice window
 - Release is on file



POSTSECONDARY



S40	Postsecondary Enrollment – Payment of Charges
S41	Postsecondary Enrollment - Other
S84	Early Middle College ->1.0 FTE



POSTSECONDARY

- Postsecondary Reasons
 - Pupil not enrolled in grade 9-12.
 - Eligible charges are not paid by the district.
 - Postsecondary classes are reported on pupil schedule as placeholders.
 - Pupil's number of courses exceeded maximum allowable.
- Early Middle College Reasons
 - Pupil was not reported with 3500 code by Fall semester of junior year.
 - Criteria was not met to allow greater than 1.0 FTE.



POSTSECONDARY

- SAFEGUARDS & STRATEGIES
 - Postsecondary course must be on pupil schedule and cannot be reported as a place holder.
 - School district must pay for the postsecondary course.
 - EMC qualify for extra FTE if EMC program pupil was coded as 3500 by 11th grade, and pupil will graduate in less than 5 years from high school and earn 60 college credits/associates degree. Review plan and transcript to verify.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

- Special Education Reasons
 - A general finding should be issued when FTE split does not match Worksheets A & B.
 - A specific finding should be issued when FTE split is not correct between General Education and Special Education.
 - Reduced schedule special ed students did not have a documented IEP or note from an allowable medical professional.
- Special Education Early Childhood Reasons
 - Scheduling was inaccurate for the type of special education program.
 - 1862 72 hours during calendar year
 - 1755 72 hours during school year
 - Instruction not provided by approved ECSE teacher or staff supervised by approved ECSE teacher.



SPECIAL EDUCATION

- SAFEGUARDS & STRATEGIES
 - Make sure Special Ed A/B worksheet FTE matches FTE reported in MSDS. Check against IEPs. Make sure GE/SE FTE split correctly.
 - Make sure pupil reported in the correct SE program (not disability code, but program code).
 - For Special Ed ECSE make sure attendance matches FTE claimed.
 - ECSE 1755/1862 Service Program
 - Verify there are 72 hours scheduled in a school year for 1755 and in the calendar year for 1862.
 - Verify the certified teacher signed the service log.

HOMEBOUND, HOSPITALIZED, OR HOME-BASED

- Homebound, home-based, or hospitalized reasons
 - Documentation did not include a statement from a qualified medical professional.
 - Weekly contacts were not met.
 - Excused absence documentation was not provided.
 - FTE calculation was incorrect.
 - Special Ed weekly contacts allow no proration.



HOMEBOUND, HOSPITALIZED, OR HOME-BASED

- SAFEGUARDS & STRATEGIES
- Verify 2 weekly contacts with teacher (2-1 hour for pupils with IEPs with 30-minute break, 2–45-minute contacts for general ed pupils).
- If pupil misses, must be excused absence signed by parent.
 - Student with IEP will need deviation from OSE if services are missed.
- If homebound/hospitalized, need doctor's statement.
- If home-based, 2-1-hour weekly contacts with teacher and mandatory expulsion by statute (weapons, arson, CSC, bomb threat) eligible for 1.0 FTE but if local district suspension/expulsion (drugs) then FTE prorated.

VIRTUAL LEARNING

- Virtual Learning Reasons
 - There was a lack of two-way communication between teacher/mentor and pupil.
 - Interactions were not course content or course progress related.
 - Teacher or mentor was not employed by the district and did not meet one of the allowable exceptions.
 - Mass email was sent to a group of pupils with no additional individual communication between individual pupil and teacher/mentor.
 - Class was not on the pupil's schedule.
 - Appropriately placed teacher of record was not assigned to each pupil's class.
 - Auditor Note: Seat Time Waivers have been discontinued, please ensure you use the \$85 Virtual Learning 2-way finding.



VIRTUAL LEARNING

- SAFEGUARDS & STRATEGIES
 - 2- way interaction between pupil and teacher/mentor was not recorded for all 4 weeks of the count period (Wed-Tues).
 - 2- way interaction does not reflect course content or course progress.
 - Teacher/mentor was not assigned to student or employed by district.
 - Teacher/mentor sent a mass email and didn't close loop with each virtual learning pupil.
 - District did not pay for virtual learning course.

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING PUPILS

- Experiential Learning Reasons
 - Teacher is concurrently teaching another course.
 - Attendance was not taken for both the experience and classroom instruction.
 - EDP was not in place.
 - Course not identified on student's schedule.



EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING PUPILS

- SAFEGUARDS & STRATEGIES
 - Verify teacher is not teaching two courses at the same time (experiential learning course and another course).
 - Ensure attendance is taken in both the classroom and during the direct experience.
 - Verify student has an EDP on file.
 - Course cannot be a placeholder on student's schedule (ie. Experiential Learning). Should say Teacher Cadet Experiential Learning.
 - Only one experience allowed per semester or term.
