

This guide is designed to help schools identify education and training that is required for Michigan schools. In the first section of this guide, training is organized by subject. In the second section, the training is broken out by employee groups. Both sections contain the following information:

- Subject: the topic addressed by the training. Policy courses, which are designed to satisfy implementation requirements for policies boards of education are required by law to adopt, are listed in red. Part of the compliance requirements for these courses includes employee review of the district's policies.
- Governing Reference: the regulation or standard that outlines the training requirements. It is important to refer to the actual regulation/standard to ensure compliance with all requirements.
- · Training Schedule: the frequency with which the training needs to occur.
- Personnel: the employee(s) impacted by the training and/or exposed to specific hazards.
- Training/Vector Solutions: the training resource is listed for your convenience. When
 available, the corresponding Vector Solutions training class is listed. Vector Solutions
 training data and management is a value-added benefit available to SET SEG members,
 but it should be evaluated and supplemented with district specific information when
 necessary to be compliant.

At the end of this guide, you'll find a glossary of terms and a list of additional resources that can be helpful if you need to do further research about a particular subject or training requirement.



Section 380.1310b

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THE REVISED SCHOOL CODE (EXCERPT) Act 451 of 1976

380.1310b Policy prohibiting bullying; adoption and implementation; public hearing; submission of policy to department; contents of policy; annual report of incidents of bullying; form and procedure; school employee, school volunteer, pupil, or parent or guardian reporting act of bullying to school official; modified policy; definitions; section to be known as "Matt Epling Safe School Law."

Sec. 1310b.

- (1) The board of a school district or intermediate school district or board of directors of a public school academy shall adopt and implement a policy prohibiting bullying at school, as defined in this section.
- (2) Subject to subsection (3), before adopting the policy required under subsection (1) or any modification to the policy, the board or board of directors shall hold at least 1 public hearing on the proposed policy or modification. This public hearing may be held as part of a regular board meeting. Subject to subsection (3), not later than 30 days after adopting or modifying the policy under subsection (1), the board or board of directors shall submit a copy of its policy to the department.
- (3) If, as of March 31, 2015, a school district, intermediate school district, or public school academy has already adopted and implemented an existing policy prohibiting bullying at school and that policy is in compliance with subsections (1) and (5), the board of the school district or intermediate school district or board of directors of the public school academy is not required to adopt and implement a modified policy under subsection (1). However, this subsection applies to a school district, intermediate school district, or public school academy described in this subsection only if the board or board of directors submits a copy of its policy to the department not later than May 31, 2015.
- (4) Not later than 1 year after the deadline under subsection (2) for districts and public school academies to submit copies of their modified policies to the department, the department shall submit a report to the senate and house standing committees on education summarizing the status of the implementation of the modifications to policies required under 2014 PA 478.
- (5) A policy adopted pursuant to subsection (1) shall include at least all of the following:
- (a) A statement prohibiting bullying of a pupil. Not later than October 1, 2015, this statement shall be modified as necessary to comply with 2014 PA 478 including, but not limited to, the inclusion of cyberbullying as a form of bullying.
- (b) A statement prohibiting retaliation or false accusation against a target of bullying, a witness, or another person with reliable information about an act of bullying.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Annual Training: Training within a 12-month period.

Bloodborne Pathogens: Category A – employees who have tasks that involve reasonably

anticipated exposure to blood or other potentially infectious material. This includes emergency medical responders and tasks conducted in

non-routine situations as a condition of employment.

Confined Space: Attendant – individual stationed outside one or more permit

spaces who monitors the authorized entrants and who performs all attendant's duties assigned in the employer's permit space program.

Authorized – employee who is authorized by the employer to enter a

permit space.

Affected – employee whose work is affected by a confined permit

space

Initial Training: Training required prior to beginning work.

Lockout/Tagout: Affected – employees whose job requires the operation or use of a

machine or equipment on which servicing or maintenance is being performed under lockout or tagout or whose job requires him/her to work in an area in which such servicing or maintenance is being

performed.

Authorized – a person who locks or tags out machines or equipment in order to perform servicing or maintenance on that machine or

equipment.

Policy Course: Instructional class designed to satisfy implementation requirements

for policies boards of education are required by law to adopt. Part of the compliance requirements for these courses includes employee

review of district policy.

Underground Storage Tanks: Class A Operator – This is the person who has primary responsibility

to operate and maintain the underground storage tank system.

Class B – This is the person who has primary responsibility to operate and maintain the underground storage tank system. For a typical gas station, it is the owner of the station or his designee.

Class C Operator – an individual who is responsible for responding to alarms or other indications of emergencies caused by spills, releases or overfills associated with an underground storage tank system.

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

Course Note

This course has additional requirements to meet compliance.

AHERA: All maintenance and custodial staff who may work in a building that contains asbestos-building materials (ACBM) must receive at least two hours of asbestos awareness training whether or not they are required to work with ACBM.

- Maintenance and custodial staff conducting any activities that will result in the disturbance to ACBM must receive an additional 14 hours of training.
- The LEA must ensure that new custodial and maintenance employees are trained within sixty days after commencement of employment.
- The LEA must ensure that short-term workers who may come in contact with asbestos (e.g. utility repair workers) are informed of the location of ACBM.
