Office of Educator Excellence: Workforce Areas





Related State Budget Investments

- FY 20 and earlier: \$0 in state school aid act to address teacher shortage
- FY21: \$5M for early career teacher retention bonuses
- > FY22: Less than \$2M for grow-your-own programs
- FY23: \$575M for a range of efforts to address teacher shortage
- FY24: Over \$445M for a range of efforts to address teacher shortage



Highlights from FY 23 and FY 24 Budgets

Goal 7: Increase the Numbers of Teachers in Areas of Shortage



Organizational Support

- Talent Together (\$10M and \$66.3M FY23 budget supplemental)
 - Funding for teacher recruitment, development, and retention as part of a consortium of at least 45 ISDs
- > Teach for America (\$5M FY24)
 - Funding to support Teach for America's TeachMichigan initiative for teacher recruitment, retention, development, innovation, and evaluation costs



Teacher Candidate Fellowships and Stipends

- MI Future Educator Fellowship (\$25M FY23; \$25M FY24)
 - \$10,000 scholarship for candidates enrolled in teacher preparation programs
- MI Future Educator Student Teacher Stipend (\$50M FY23; \$50M FY24)
 - \$9,600 stipend to support candidates participating in student teaching







Future Proud Michigan Educator

> Grow Your Own (\$175M FY23)

 Grants to districts for a no-cost pathway to support staff to obtain certification and EXPLORE programming

Future PME Military Veterans (\$15M FY23)

 Grant to districts to pay for mentorship and salary for military veterans seeking educator certification





Other Financial Supports for Educator Recruitment

> MTTC Fee Reimbursement (\$1M FY24)

- Reimbursement of test fee for individuals taking a test for the first time
- > Rural Educator Credentialing Hub (\$15M FY24)
 - Grant to lead educator preparation provider to lead a pilot consortium to assist rural educators with "crossing the finish line" to certification





Student Loan Repayment

\$225M FY24

- \$200/month; \$400/month if band 6 of 31a
- Eligibility:
 - Enrolled in federal public service loan forgiveness program (FPSLFP)
 - Making payments toward FPSLFP
 - Employed in district or ISD in role working directly with PK-12 students (e.g., teacher, SSW, reading specialist)
- Application availability and technical assistance: late winter





National Board

\$5M FY24

- 1. Recognizes already board-certified teachers
 - ✓ \$4,000 to teachers with NBC; \$6,000 to those in Title I buildings
 - Must hold: 1) NBC by Jan 1, 2024 and 2) valid or expired teaching certificate
 - Must be: 1) employed by district or ISD as a teacher and 2) teach at least 50% of the full-time hours
- 2. Encourages board certification
 - Teach in Title I school
 - ✓ Hold valid or expired MI teaching certificate
 - First time candidate for NBC





Mentoring and Induction

50M FY24

- 1. Materials Creation grant: \$500,000
 - Funds to ISD or other education organization to develop standards, curricula, and professional learning for mentors of teachers, administrators, and counselors
- 2. Program Evaluation grant: \$500,000
 - Funds to evaluate mentoring and induction programs
- 3. District grants: \$49M
 - Over 5 years to support mentor stipends, professional learning, release time, and other expenses related to mentoring and induction

EXPLORE Grant Opportunity

- > Use grant funds to build programs and remove barriers, such as:
 - Transportation to clinical sites
 - College campus visits
 - Mentor teacher stipends
 - Summer experiences
- Application: Dec 2023 Jan 2024
 Award Period: Oct 1, 2023 Sept 30, 2024
