### **Performance Period and Liquidation Period**

ARP Grant Performance Period Concludes	Friday, November 29, 2024	<ul> <li>ARP Program Period of Performance concludes on Friday, November 29, 2024. This means that:</li> <li>ARP recipients must be in receipt of all equipment and supplies of validly obligated (MDE approved) purchases that will be submitted for possible payment by Friday, November 29, 2024.</li> <li>Final Expenditure Report (FER) is due by November 29, 2024.</li> <li>Note that services are obligated on the day they are performance, which means that all services provided must end by Monday, September 30, 2024.</li> </ul>
ARP Grant Liquidation Period Concludes	Monday, December 30, 2024	All requests for payment must be submitted on or before Monday, December 30, 2024, to be considered for payment using ARP funding.
ARP Grant Close Out	Wednesday, January 29, 2025	MDE, as the SEA, must fully liquidate and close out ARP funding.

## How is Michigan doing?

- Federal ESF site (last update was July 31, 2024)
  - Education Stabilization Fund
- Michigan districts had drawn 85% of ARP funds
- National Average among 52 recipients was 78%
- Michigan was 12/52 (Top Quartile)





### **Late Liquidation Extension Details:**

- USED has authority to approve liquidation extension requests based upon the specific facts and circumstances of a given obligation and upon written request of a MDE on behalf of itself or its subrecipient
- MDE **MUST** submit complete request = Reflects a forecast of funds to be liquidated during the extension period. USED recommends submissions by December 31, 2024.
- Subrecipient **MUST** complete authorized template, by individual expenditure, signed by authorized official.
- Subrecipient **MUST** provide a cover letter that explains how the ARP liquidation extension request contributes to the acceleration of academic success for students

## Late Liquidation Extension Resources:

As a reminder, any grantee that intends to submit an ARP Act liquidation extension request for itself or its subrecipients must complete a request template detailing the grantee and subrecipient funds included in the request and provide a signed attestation from an authorizing official. Additionally, the grantee must provide a cover letter that explains how the ARP ESSER or ARP EANS liquidation extension request contributes to the acceleration of academic success for students.

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# Late Liquidation Extension Template:

Use of Funds	Justification	Other Subrecipient-Specific Data Notes
Examples might include: construction contract(s), HVAC contract(s), instructional services contract(s), delayed materials/supplies, or for other allowable uses.  All funds included in the request for extension must be properly obligated by September 30, 2024 and for allowable uses. Requests must be aligned to particular projects or specific circumstances at the subrecipient level.	Provide explanation for funds that may not be liquidated by the end of the regulatory liquidation period (1/28/25) based on the uses of funds listed in column I.  Needing more time to expend funds is not an adequate reason or justification for a liquidation extension. Examples might include delays related to supply or labor shortages.  The justification to substantiate an independent request will be viviewed consistent with State and Federal oversight practices.	This column is available for any additional information the grantee or subrecipient may want to include regarding data outliers or other associated/applicable information.  The approval of the State's request is not dependent upon the addition of notes for every subrecipient/LEA during the request and approval process.



### **Late Liquidation Extension Timeline:**

Submission of Late Liquidation Extension requests: October 1 – December 1

Submission must be complete:

- Template with each individual expenditure listed separately
- Attestation by Authorized Official at District
- Cover Page with Academic Success Narrative (Justification)

MDE will review submissions and compile all submissions to submit to USED by December 31

- 200.318: General Procurement Standards (page 9)
- 200.324: Contract Cost and Price (page 10)
- Increased Thresholds:
  - Equipment (200.313) Increases from \$5,000 to \$10,000
  - Unused Supplies (200.314) Increases from \$5,000 to \$10,000 Single
     Audit (200.501) Increases from \$750,000 to \$1,000,000
  - De Minimis Indirect Rate Increases from 10% to 15%

- 29 (78%) are designated grants (assigned to a specific district or vendor)
- 5 new grants are competitive and 3 are formula-based grants

Sec. 12d: School Consolidation and Infrastructure - Competitive

Sec. 25l: Early Warning – Competitive, must be ISD
