
#### Virtual Town Hall and Committee Meetings



Since 1998, more than 2,800 members have earned an MSBO Voluntary Certification Award.







The annual MSBO audit, conducted by Plante Moran, received a clean audit opinion. The Financial Review Committee voted to accept the report and recommended the full Board accept it. The MSBO Board accepted the audit report.
