GUIDING PRINCIPLES AND STRATEGIC GOALS THESE CRITERIA SUPPORT

This grant supports Michigan’s Top 10 Strategic Education Plan of the State Board of Education (SBE) and the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) by supporting learning and learners through funding for local education agencies (LEAs) to address learning loss among students. This funding also supports Guiding Principle 1 by providing access to high-quality instruction designed to close achievement and opportunity gaps caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

PURPOSE / BACKGROUND OF GRANT

- A link to the plan to address learning loss is posted on the LEA’s website, and assurance to post updates to the plan on the LEA’s website.

- A brief description of the district metrics to be used to determine the impact of the district's funded initiatives.

Proposed by Staff:

- Applications must be received by November 30, 2022.

Eligible applicants are local education agencies (LEAs).

The target population is students experiencing learning loss.


